PASSENGER SAFETY SKITS

DIRECTIONS: Work in a small group to create and perform a short skit that shows how a student can speak up when they feel unsafe as a passenger. Your skit should include both the problem and a smart way to handle it.

YOUR SKIT SHOULD INCLUDE:

- At least one student noticing unsafe behavior by a driver.
- At least one student speaking up.
- The driver's reaction.
- Any other details you'd like to include.

GROUP GUIDELINES:

- Everyone must have a role in the skit. However, everyone doesn't have to speak.
- Skits should be no more than three minutes long.
- Keep it school-appropriate, clear and realistic.

TIPS FOR A GREAT SKIT:

- Speak clearly and loud enough for others to hear.
- Keep your movements big and your message simple.
- Have fun — but help your audience learn something too!
- Rehearse before you perform your skit for the class!
